# 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Report

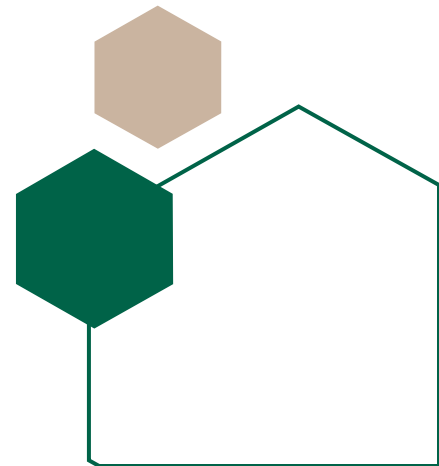

- The highlight game of the year was defeating Belmont in a shutout performance, 5-0 with our pitching keeping them to only 4 hits across 9 innings of shutout baseball



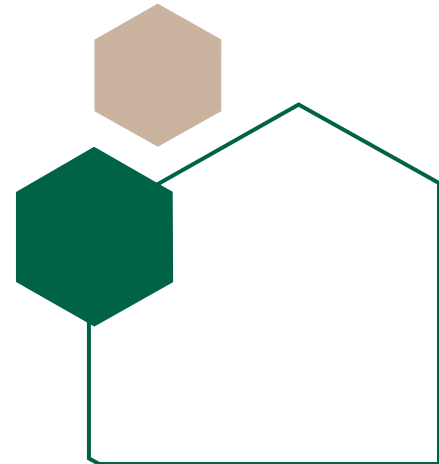

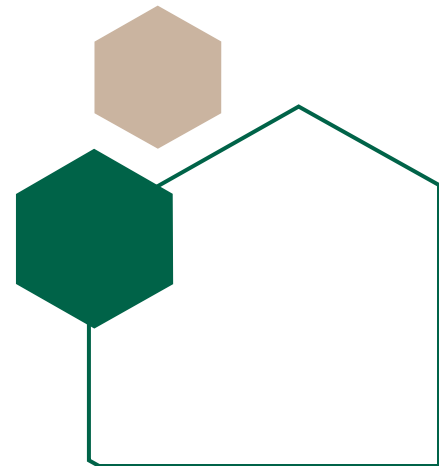

I would like to acknowledge our Boomerangs Board and Ann Voigt for the best baseball ground in Newcastle, Boomerang Field.





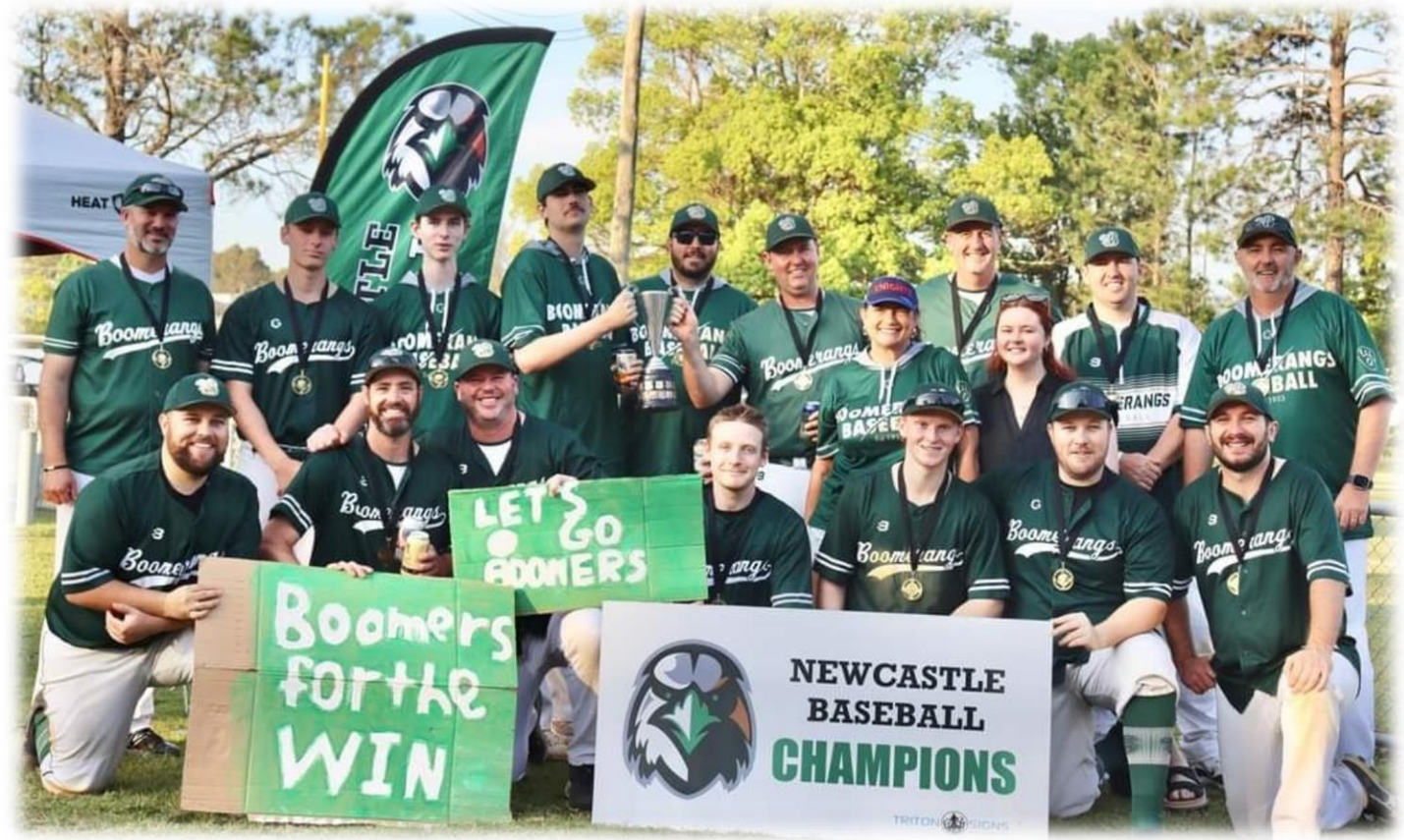

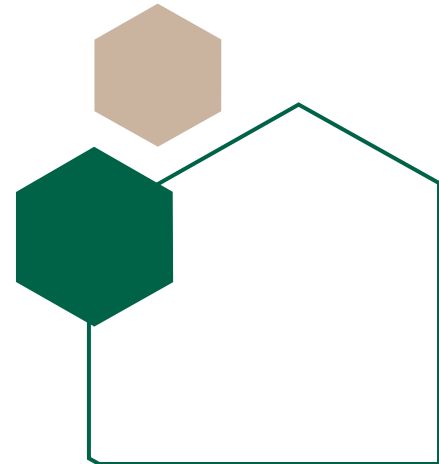

- The club's overall performance and commitment from the players all year long (albeit the frustrating weather)

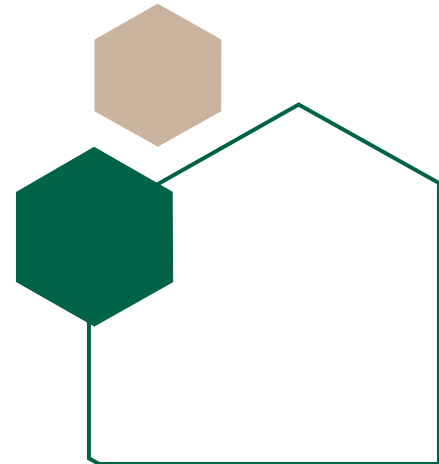
I need to thank few people for their help throughout the season;

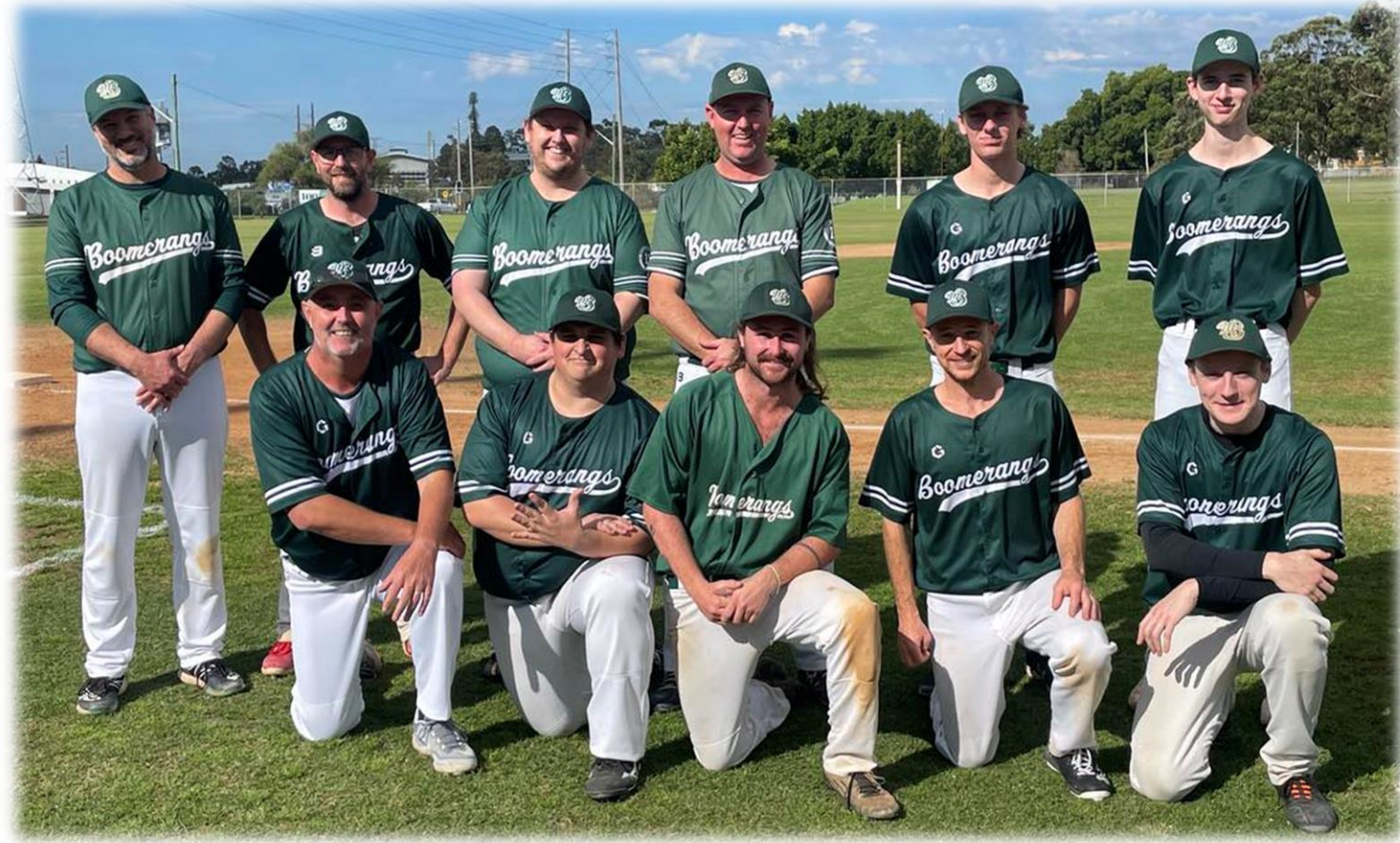

With a mixture of new and old faces 4<sup>th</sup> grade set out the season with high expectations.

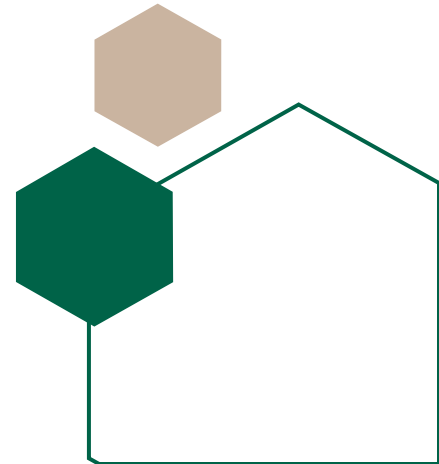

# 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Report

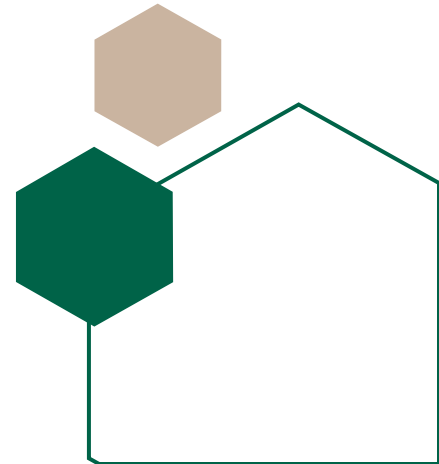
We had (11) regular players registered to play 5th Grade Minor League baseball this season:

Our catchers were primarily Angus Blinman and Craig Pearson with assistance provided by Kayla Darnell, Hudson Frank and Drew Carson.

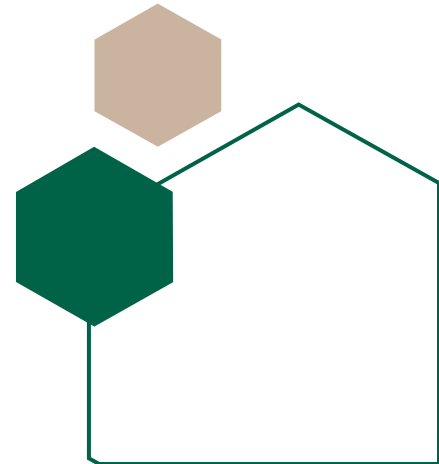

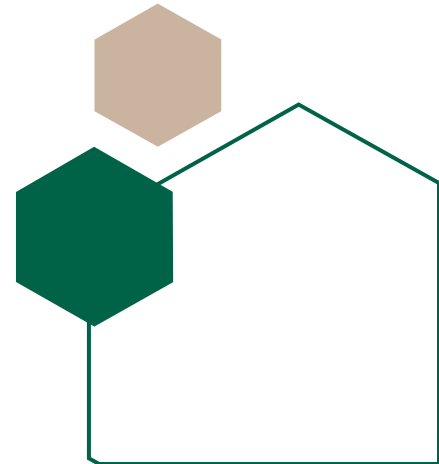
# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade White Report

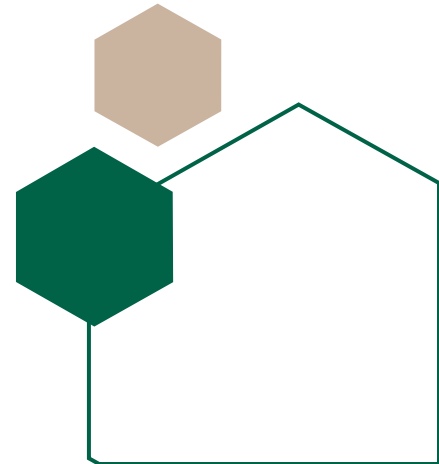
# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade White Report

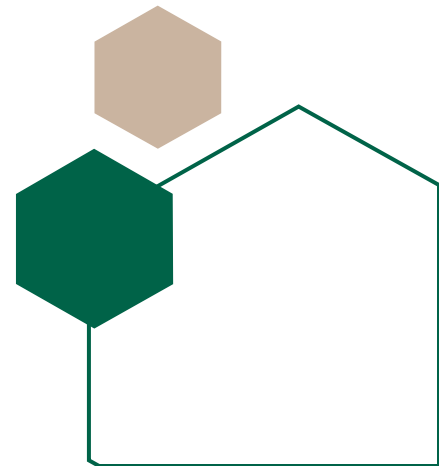

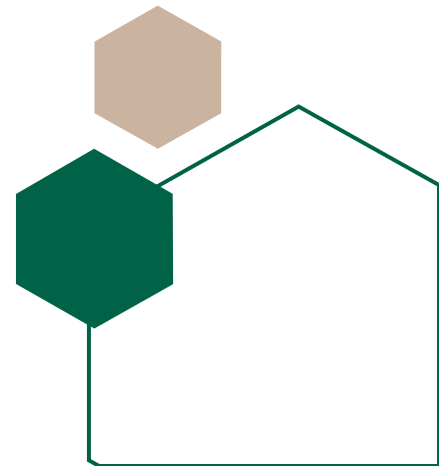


# Boomerangs Junior League Report

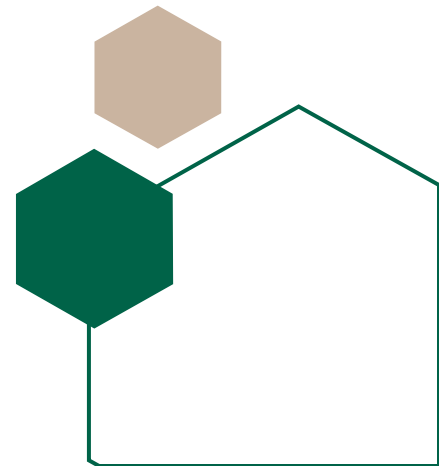

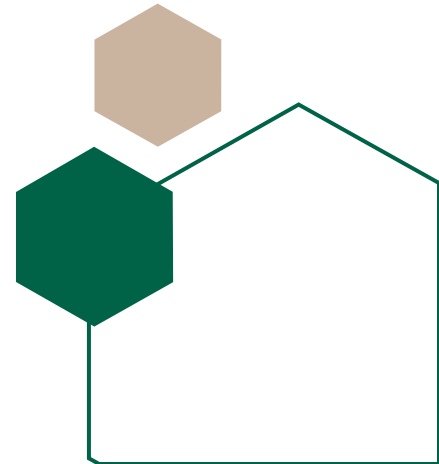

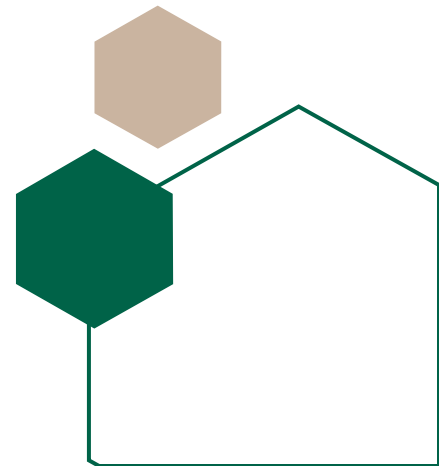
# Boomerangs Little League Report

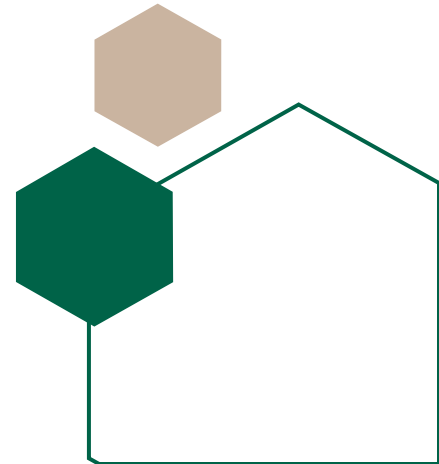

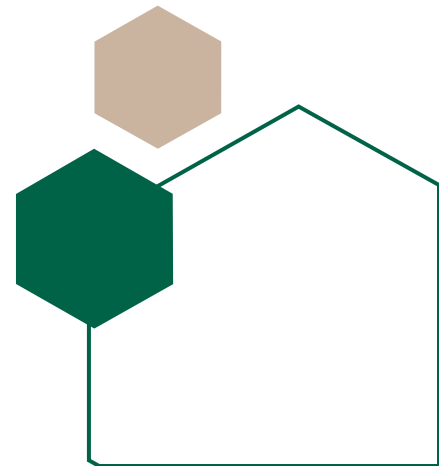




# Zooka/Teeball Report
